
# 2012-13 Plan Summary

<u>2012</u>	<b>Gas Budget</b>	<b>Dth Savings</b>
Residential	\$5,940,706	245,279
Low income	\$3,701,422	61,726
Business	\$1,627,048	104,291
Indirect	\$1,949,156	23,758
Total	\$13,218,332	435,054

<u>2013</u>	<b>Gas Budget</b>	<b>Dth Savings</b>
Residential	\$6,049,007	250,289
Low income	\$3,742,068	58,843
Business	\$1,506,725	95,419
Indirect/Pilots	\$1,986,561	23,758
Total	\$13,284,361	428,309



## **Gas Savings and Spend Trend**





### **New in 2012**

- Portfolio impacts due to gas prices
  - Strategy to maintain stable program offerings
  - Lower budgets & higher impacts for portfolio
  - Lower rebates for business programs
- Increased verification for Insulation program
- BPI certifications required for Home Performance



## **Experiences & Lessons Learned**

- ▶ 52% of audit participants implement an EE measure
- Interest in Insulation rebates remains high
- Furnace participation remains high after ARRA funds depleted
- Increased program participation in Energy Star® New Homes
- Lower natural gas prices affect our strategy
