Across the state of Utah

- 876,459 customers** are served by ENERGY STAR utility partners
- 26,202 homes** have earned the ENERGY STAR

- 417 buildings** have earned the ENERGY STAR for superior efficiency, including 269 schools, 3 hotels, 1 hospital, 63 office buildings, and 4 industrial facilities
